2006

- **Baltimore:** *Christmas Program with 450 Police Athletic League Center Children. 18 Children from 25 Centers created a magnormous Christmas Event. TNMSO raised about \$25,000.00 to give each child \$50.00 to spend in Wal-Mart and/or Target Stores on themselves to allow them interaction and interface with merchants to empower them to make purchases while giving them a gift during the holiday season. TNMSO hosted a Christmas Party for the 450 children at the Ravens Stadium and Special Guest Patti Labelle came and spoke to the children to inspire them to listen and respect their elders.*

2007

- **Miami:** *The National M.O.M. Squad Organization 1st Annual Super Charity Week - Bowling event with the NFL Youth Education Town Center Children. 50 Children from the Miami YET Center came and shared in a competitive activity as TNMSO hosted a Bowling tournament for the YET Children creating a positive environment.*
- **Miami:** *Super Bowl - The National M.O.M. Squad Organization raised about \$5000.00 to purchase a week's worth of school uniforms for 500 children ages 7 - 17. The uniforms consist of blue, black, and beige, kaki pants and polo shirts to match.*
- **Baltimore:** *A Summer Food Program was funded \$6000.00 by The National M.O.M. Squad Organization for The Police Athletic League Centers in Baltimore, MD. Hot lunch and snacks were served to hundreds of children of the PAL Centers for 3 months.*
- **Dallas:** *Jubilee Celebrity Fashion Extravaganza presented by TNMSO and American Airlines - The NMSO raised \$30,000 for the Inner-City*

Development Corporation benefit to support the youth in the revitalization of their community. The revitalization offered jobs to the youth of that community with the build of laundry mats, skating rink, and other stores. Our Inspirational and Influential speaker for the children was Dr. Benjamin Carson to share word of encouragement to inspire the children to be successful regardless of the poverish environments they live in and experience. In addition, the children were very excited to see "Lenny" as Batman of Gotham City. Lenny, was fully decked out in his Batman attire and arrived in the Bat-Mobile for all to see.*

2008

- *Phoenix: The National M.O.M. Squad Organization 2nd Annual Super Charity Week - Espiritu Youth Education Town Academy benefit. TNMSO presented \$10,000.00 for the Athletic Program at Espiritu YET Academy. The Academy advised TNMSO that their school was in need of transportation for the athletic program which currently struggles to transport over 100 athletes in grades 7-12 with only one SUV to transport the children to away games. The Academy did not have transportation and with the MOM Squad help they now have 10K towards the purchase of transportation.*
- *Phoenix: The National M.O.M. Squad Organization helped Travis LaBoy Foundation and Michael Boley's Foundation raise funds for Children with Autism during Super Bowl XLII.*
- *Dallas: The National M.O.M. Squad Organization 1st Annual Conference "One Voice, One Vessel, One Vision and One Victory" in theme. The MOM Squad supported the Darrent Williams Foundation and presented a Literacy Program with the Inner-City Children of Ft. Worth, TX at the Ella Mae Gratts Shamlee Branch Library, 1062 Evans Ave, Fort Worth, TX.*
